#### **Managing Director's Introduction**



EBSI has experienced an extremely busy year having placed 2,757 students in work experience placements. Of these 524 were in vocationally linked placements with employers. 2,233 students were in Year 10 and 524 students were in Year 12. We have also met with 954 employers this year to ensure that these placements are safe and that the experiences for both the students and employers are worthwhile. On top of that we have also worked with 2,420 students and helped prepare them for the world of work through work related learning events such as Mock Interviews, Career Taster Days, Enterprise Days and Skills for Work Workshops.

We have also been focusing on our companies partnerships and have delivered various projects with partners such as Coca-Cola Enterprises, QED (working with women from 3rd World Countries on integration into the UK). Business in the Community (BITC) and the Mosaic Enterprise Challenge. We have also forged links with Thames Water to help promote their education centres with schools in and around West London. Lastly, we facilitated a 10 day visit for three Italian visitors who spent time with us finding out how the UK Education System works, ways in which to combat students from dropping out of the Italian Education system, including improving their employability prospects. The 10 day visit was a huge success and EBSI look forward to building on this partnership to exchange ideas and maybe even students in the near future.

It is without doubt that EBSI's work could not be achieved without the valuable work and support that employers and their staff offer us. EBSI is grateful to all the companies on our database that offer not only work experience to thousands of students, but also the dedication from all the volunteers who give up their time in kind to help the work of EBSI. Whether this be through Mock interviews, CV writing or Enterprise workshops, all of which are aimed at helping the future generation of young people to prosper and achieve in this ever changing world that we are all living in.

I would therefore like to take this opportunity to thank you all so much for your support as without this we could not continue to do this great work.


The feedback on the day from all students was extremely positive and they all came away with insights into industry, tips for future careers and the various alternative routes they could take.

# Bishopshalt High School Sixth Form Conference

**Sponsored by Brunel University** 

Education Business Services International UK Ltd (EBSI UK Ltd) arranged a Sixth Form Conference at Brunel University on behalf of Bishopshalt High School.





This annual event which is hosted at Brunel is intended to encourage students to consider their STEM related subjects and the future career possibilities in the Engineering industry. Students

attended the two day event at Brunel University. The event provided a fun and interactive method of developing students' core communication and interpersonal skills.

The variety of activities carried out over the two days were aimed at introducing students to the concept of enterprise, engineering and team building, which allows them to develop vital skills of innovation, creativity and risk management.

200 Students were given the opportunity at the two day conference to undertake several activities and also to carry out final demonstrations of their work. The Egg Challenge required teams of students to design and build protection for an egg so it could be dropped from a height without breaking to see if their engineering concepts worked or not!

The Enterprise Challenge required the students to work in groups to re-brand a music band, organise a re-launch event for the band, work on a marketing campaign, re-style the band and decide what music they should play at the event.

All of the groups then delivered five-minute presentations to a panel of judges. The conference was kindly supported by employees from The Department for Work and Pensions, British Airways and also Brunel University Ambassadors.

### **Inspiring Youth Programme - The Launch!**

Heathrow Community Fund, in partnership with The National Citizen Service and The Mosaic Challenge to celebrate the launch of Inspiring Youth. The event which took place at The London Museum of Water & Steam, in Brentford. Heathrow Community Fund are funding both organisations to engage with more than 3,000 young people in the Heathrow area in social action to support their community and help them develop valuable new skills at the same time.

Heathrow Community Fund are encouraging The National Citizen Service

and Mosaic to work with local providers such as EBSI to deliver some of these programmes in local schools.

The evening was hosted by Asad Ahmad – BBC newsreader who explained how he had been invited along with several other people by HRH The Prince of Wales to take part in a series of discussions and meetings to help think of a way to reach out to Young British Muslims, often living in disadvantaged

areas, to help them to fulfil their potential by achieving their goals, aims and ambitions. HRH The Prince of Wales's Mosaic charity was set up and Asad Ahmad was asked to launch the event.

Jamela Khan and Arun Madar from EBSI both attended the event, as they are working in partnership with Mosaic to engage schools in Ealing and Hillingdon to participate in the Mosaic Enterprise Challenge. Abbotsfield School for Boys did extremely well in the Mosaic Challenge to get through to the Semi Finals. A huge thank you to the students for getting involved and also to the Barclays Bank staff who mentored the students.

## European Integration Funded Project - Working in partnership with QED

EBSI is working in partnership with the QED Foundation Limited a registered charity which is funded by the European Integration Fund to promote ESOL classes, for the integration of women who have recently arrived into the country. The project is aimed at introducing the women who have been in the UK for less than 10 years and encourages them to integrate into mainstream society.

The project has 3 strands, which expects the women to attend 3 weekly sessions at a local school. The topics covered are the English language, the History of the country, the very basics of the social economic system and the fundamental norms and values of the British culture in the UK.

The programme aims to reach 40 women throughout the course of the project.

To date, the women who are local to Beaconsfield Primary School where the programme is hosted, have completed their ESOL classes. They also attended a heritage visit to Windsor Castle. All of the women were encouraged to use public transport to help develop their confidence. The ladies thoroughly enjoyed the experience and hope to return again with their families!

Arun Madar also organised for the women to meet two female entrepreneurs at EBSI's office in Uxbridge, as part of their 10 week programme. The women were inspired by the talks from the business leaders, and encouraged to persevere with learning the English language and to think about trying to set up their own businesses in the future whilst bringing up their young families.

## Cooperative "IL Girasole" Shadow EBSI



EBSI welcomed Italian visitors Grazia, Antonio and Fabiana from Cooperative "IL Girasole" to the UK in April to shadow staff and

to find out more about the different projects that EBSI carryout with schools and businesses. The trip as part of a project which was IFOA financed by the Regional Government of Emilia Romagna and is dedicated to people interested in going abroad for a 2 week internship in a foreign company. "IL Girasole" Cooperative is based in Modena, Italy and leads different projects in order to prevent school students from dropping out of the education system.

EBSI is keen to build links with International businesses and this was a great opportunity to build a partnership with one from Italy. The Italian visitors shadowed staff at meetings, events and conferences with corporate companies, training providers and schools e.g. BT Open World, British Airways, Bucks New University, Brunel University, Youth Skills Development Trust, MOSAIC Regional Finals Event, The Ellen Wilkinson School for Girls, Fulham Cross Girls School and Dormers Wells High School.

"We were interested in understanding the prevention projects of a company similar to us in goals, purpose and aims. EBSI gave us the opportunity to shadow their staff for 10 days and we appreciated its

capability to build strong relationships between schools and companies thanks to a network of volunteers. We found their "Mock Interview" Programme very interesting as it showed us how students can learn that their studies have an impact on their lives and showed them how they need to behave and dress during a job interview when they are very young".

"The engagement of volunteers was something that we really noticed, as they feel responsible towards society and the youngsters' futures."

"We would like to continue to work with EBSI in order to exchange good practice and bring the English system of education and business to Modena, after careful analysis of the Italian young people's needs. The experience and knowledge of EBSI would be very valuable for us in order to fight against the NEET phenomenon and improve youngster's employability prospects."
